

# ZAGREB WAS HOST OF THE 183RD EAAE SEMINAR ON EXPERIMENTAL ECONOMICS

The 183rd Seminar of the European Association of Agricultural Economists (EAAE), entitled Experimental and Behavioural Economics Research in Agri-Food and the Environment, was organised in the framework of the H2020 project AgriFoodBoost. The seminar was held on September 8-9, 2022 in Zagreb at the Hotel International. There were 71 participants from 17 countries. 58 papers (2 plenary, 45 oral and 11 poster) were presented at the Seminar. The Seminar provided great debates, discussions and knowledge exchange between young and senior researchers from different subfields interested in experimental and behavioural economics methods, both from methodological and empirical point of view. In addition, the Seminar included a three-hour training on power analysis led by Jens Rommel (Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences).

# WORKSHOP ON EXPERIENCES AND POSIBILITIES FOR INTERACTIVE NETWORKING BETWEEN RESEARCH INSTITUTIONS AND AGRIFOOD BUSINESS ENTITIES

On 18 May 2022, a workshop on experiences and opportunities for interactive networking between research institutions and companies in the agri-food sector was held in the resort of Polovanec near Zagreb. The aim of the workshop was to familiarise stakeholders from the agricultural sector and public administration with the possibilities of cooperation with the established Research Centre for Experimental Economy. During the workshop, stakeholders had the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the application of experimental economics in the fields of agriculture, food and environment.

In total, 7 invited representatives and 5 staff members of the AgriFoodBoost project of the Faculty of Agriculture of the University of Zagreb (FAZ) participated.

## PROMOTING THE ACTIVITIES OF AGRIFOODBOOST PROJECT



## SUMMER SCHOOL ON CHOICE EXPERIMENTS (BASIC LEVEL), ZAGREB

Summer school on choice experiments (basic level), 18-20 July 2022, Zagreb



Held by UNIBO members: Maurizio Canavari and Vilma Xhakollari The team members, Prof. Maurizio Canavari and dr. Vilma Xhakollari from the University of Bologna, introduced the participants to the conceptual foundations of choice experiments in three days of intensive learning. Some of the main topics covered in the course were scenarios for the application of choice experiments, choice behaviour models and utility functions, Lancaster theory and random utility theory, and labelled and unlabelled choices.

Vilma Xhakollari explained to the participants the structure of the NGENE syntax and the procedure for entering data into the Qualtrics software. Participants worked in groups to create a choice experiment scenario.

#### EXPERT VISITS, SEPTEMBER 2022

Three expert visits were conducted in September 2022. Prof. Andreas Drichoutis (AUA), together with Dr. Achilleas Vassilopoulos (AUA), assisted FAZ researchers in setting up the IT infrastructure for experimental auctions in their experimental economics laboratory. They also conducted a pilot auction as a showcase project for the FAZ researchers.



Prof. Carl-Johan Lagerkvist (SLU) visited the FAZ and consulted with young FAZ researchers about their PhD topics and other research opportunities.






#### LONG TERM MOBILITIES

With the help of expert advice from the members of the advisory board, some important conclusions have been drawn concerning efforts towards joint research and publications, HUB research activities, expert visits, joint conferences, dissemination activities and upcoming workshops and summer schools.
